## **Community Projects**

- Business Watch meetings to keep current on all projects and events.
- \*Local businesses have provided 200 breakfast plates on Christmas morning.
- Nathan Terry of Lighthouse Rescue Mission is working on breaking ground for transitional housing for the homeless.
- Tulare Police Department has developed a "SARA" project to contact the homeless and provide them information for assistance and accountability to comply with all laws and municipal codes.
- \*\*Various Tulare schools partner with local businesses to provide meals and warm clothes.

## City Efforts

- City of Tulare Municipal Code Chapter 10.147 Emergency Shelters and Transitional Housing provides for regulations and criteria to allow shelters to locate and operate within Tulare for emergency or transitional shelter facilities to ensure the provision of housing for all economic segments of the community.
- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) \$10,000 to the Tulare/Kings Continuum of Care Homeless Alliance that work to find regional and countywide solutions to homelessness, including the Annual Project Homeless Connect one-stop event designed to provide housing, services, and hospitality in a convenient forum directly to people experiencing homelessness. The event allows homeless people to access several service providers in one day as opposed to making calls and visits on their own something that could normally take weeks or months.
- Tulare Housing First Program administered by Family Services of Tulare County on behalf of the City to provide Shelter plus Care (S+C) vouchers for chronically homeless individuals.
