- 1. Support solicitation of proposals for the potential outsourcing of street sweeping services. Public Works Director Trisha Whitfield provided a report for the Board's review and consideration. Bill Shahan, CLOCEA, provided comment. Questions posed by the Board were responded to by staff. Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Sozinho, seconded by Vice President Fonseca, and unanimously carried to support solicitation of proposals for the potential outsourcing of street sweeping services.
- 2. Award a contract to Holloway Environmental Solutions, LLC of Bakersfield, CA for management and disposal of biosolids from the Wastewater Treatment Plant at a cost of \$44 per wet ton for industrial solids and \$46 per wet ton for domestic solids. Public Works Director Trisha Whitfield provided a report for the Board's review and consideration. Questions posed by the Board were responded to by Ms. Whitfield and Jeff Rogers of Holloway Environmental Solutions. Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Soto, seconded by Commissioner Sozinho, and unanimously carried to approve the item as presented.

### **BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:**

As a part of the 2019-2024 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) budget, Project WT0042 (now WT0050) was approved to create Geographic Information System (GIS) mapping of the City's utility infrastructure. The intent of this project is to establish a Geographic Information System that contains the best information that the City has access to in a digital format. This process will include pulling together detailed information from multiple sources (CAD drawings, existing GIS data points, as-built plan sets, aerial imagery etc.) and entering it into a standardized GIS data model.

Request for Qualifications for on-call GIS consulting services (RFQ 19-686) was issued on February 26, 2019. Eleven (11) firms submitted all the necessary information to be considered for inclusion in a list of pre-approved consultants to provide these services. The proposals were reviewed and rated in accordance with the consultant selection procedures identified in the RFQ, and the top two (2) firms were recommended for inclusion on the list of prequalified GIS consultants. On May 16, 2019, the Board of Public Utilities approved this list of two (2) consultants. Miller Spatial Services, LLC of Riverside, CA is included on the list of prequalified on-call GIS consultants and demonstrated in their proposal that they have the skills, expertise and resources available to meet the City's needs and timeframe to complete required GIS work.

On October 1, 2020, the Board of Public Utilities approved a contract with Miller Spatial to perform GIS data conversion services for Water, Sewer and Storm layers for a total cost of \$72,916. The vendor was planning to use off-shore labor to complete the project.

The intent of the approved scope of work with Miller Spatial was to first complete an identified area of the city as a "pilot," then the city would be split into two pieces and the city would receive deliverables for each section. The "pilot" section of the project area is where a significant amount of work would have to be done, setting the standards that will be used for

the generation of the information for the rest of the city. Shortly after BPU approval, staff met will Miller Spatial and provided required information to start the process of completing the pilot area. Initially, Miller Spatial communicated well, getting back with staff and scheduled different meetings with staff to discuss different aspects of the project. During this time, Miller Spatial did indicate that due to the pandemic, the project might take slightly longer than previously indicated. At this time, this was not surprising as everyone was grappling with impacts associated with the pandemic. A date of April 15<sup>th</sup> was agreed upon for the delivery of the pilot project.

Starting early March, Miller Spatial stopped returning phone calls, emails and voicemails. During this time, it was not uncommon for an individual to be out of contact for 14-days due to a COVID-19 infection. The weeks grew into months. The April 15<sup>th</sup> date came and went. Dozens of attempted phone calls, emails and voicemails went unanswered. On June 4, 2021, Information Technology staff reached out to the City Attorney to terminate the contract with Miller Spatial. On June 7, 2021, the City sent Miller Spatial a letter via certified mail to the address identified in the contract invoking Section V. B of the contract, Termination for Cause. The contract with Miller Spatial was terminated on June 22, 2021. This resulted in the cancellation of the purchase order that was issued to Miller Spatial.

Moving forward, staff went to the next vendor on the On-Call list, Geographic Technologies Group (GTG). GTG is the same vendor that developed the city's GIS plan, has performed some work with the City's SB2 Affordable Housing grant. They have produced quality work. By moving to the next vendor, staff is well aware that costs will significantly increase as the work will be performed within the United States, but will have a greater assurance of timely completion and will result in a high-quality end product.

City staff worked with GTG to develop a scope for the previously identified pilot area. The pilot proposal was reviewed and approved by both GIS Utility working group and GIS Governance Committee. The cost of the pilot area was a proposal with a not to exceed amount of \$25,000. On August 5, 2021, city staff held a kickoff meeting with GTG for the pilot area. On November 19, 2021 city staff received a draft of data for the identified pilot area. There were a few different issues that were identified when reviewing the information, but staff and GTG were able to work together to resolve the identified issues. Staff feels comfortable with GTG's ability to deliver on this project.

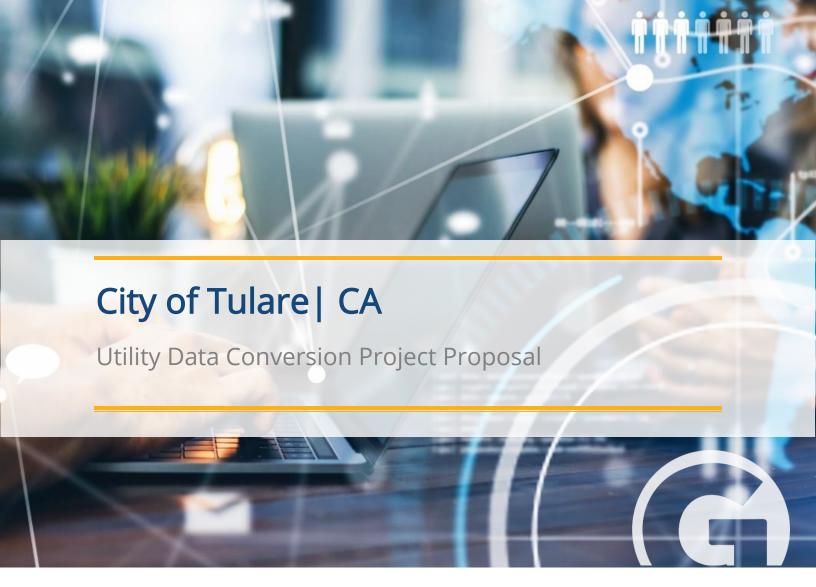
GTG has provided a fixed cost proposal to the City to digitize water, sewer and storm drain utilities for the City. The total proposal is for \$495,136.00. These funds are budgeted in project WT0050. This proposal has also been reviewed and approved by both the GIS Utility working group and the GIS Governance Committee.

The following is a proposed scope of services for a citywide utility data conversion. The recommended strategy is based on the successful completion of a pilot project completed in March 2022.



### Scope of Services

### **Pilot Project**

The pilot project included five tasks:

- **Task 1:** Developing a custom City of Tulare Utilities database design
- Task 2: Georeferencing PDF As-Built drawings as needed
- Task 3: Digitizing missing spatial features and populating missing attributes
- **Task 4:** Verification of the utility network connectivity
- **Task 5:** Delivering a complete and accurate water, sewer, and stormwater utility GIS network within the designated pilot project area

The objective of the pilot project was to identify the best approach and methodology to build an accurate water, sewer, and stormwater utility data model. The pilot project would also determine the level of effort and cost to complete a citywide utility data conversion.

Deliverable: Utility Pilot Project Results and City-wide Level of Effort Estimation

### **Proposed Citywide Utility Data Conversion Project**

The proposed citywide utility data conversion project described below follows the guidelines developed during the pilot project. It includes the same five tasks:

### Task 1: Developing a Water, Sewer, and Stormwater Utilities Database Design

The scope of the pilot project included the creation of custom water, sewer, and stormwater utilities database design. This databases design is complete and will guide the citywide utility data conversion project.

**Deliverable**: A custom City of Tulare Utilities Database Design – Complete.

### Task 2: Georeferencing PDF As-Built Drawings

The City of Tulare has more than 650 PDF files containing engineering as-builts drawings. Each PDF has multiple pages that store important spatial and attribute information about the geometry and characteristics of the water, sewer, and stormwater utility infrastructure. Task 2 includes the georeferencing of engineering as-built drawings, as needed, to allow GIS technicians to view, examine, and manually update the GIS data.

**Deliverable**: Georeferenced engineering as-built PDF CAD drawings

### Task 3: Digitize Features and Add Attributes

This task will include the use of the engineering as-built drawings to manually digitize missing GIS utility assets (lines and points) and update GIS attribution. Additionally, every asset will have an "Install Date" and "As-Built Reference Field" populated from the date and file number written on the as-built drawings.

**Deliverable**: A spatially accurate, and fully attributed water, sewer, and stormwater GIS network



### Task 4: Verify Network Connectivity

This task will include the use of the Environmental Systems Research Institute (Esri) Data Reviewer and Geometric Network tools to confirm the integrity of the water, sewer, and stormwater utilities' network connectivity.

**Deliverable**: Verification of Network Connectivity in water, sewer, and stormwater utility networks

### Task 5: Delivery of a complete and accurate water, sewer, and stormwater utility GIS network.

The final task is the delivery of a spatially accurate, fully attributed, and connected water, sewer, and stormwater utility GIS digital network.

Deliverable: Geodatabase of City of Tulare Water, Sewer, and Stormwater GIS networks

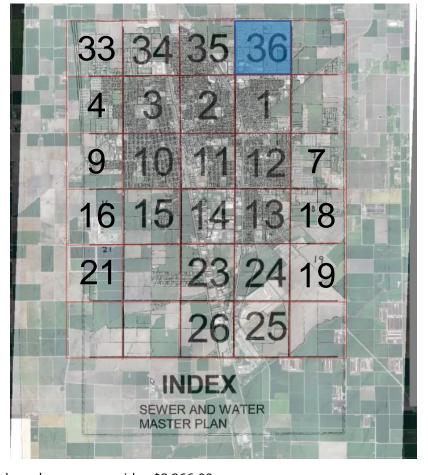

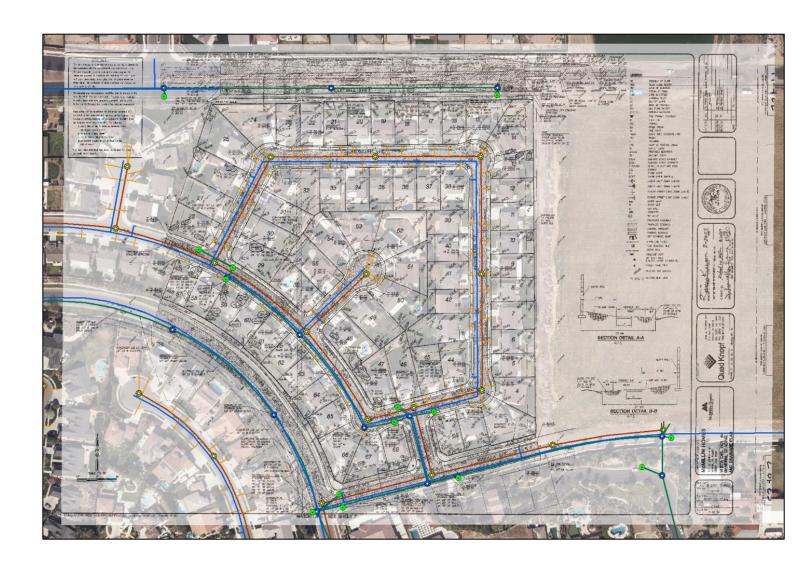
