
Zumwalt Park Redevelopment

City Council Meeting June 21, 2022





Why Is Park Redevelopment Important?

The City is committed to Downtown Redevelopment and has obligated \$9,400,000 towards that goal including:

- The key to Downtown Redevelopment is people, including; living, working, eating, recreating, and entertaining.
- Zumwalt Park is currently a passive recreational space supporting a variety of temporary community type events.
- The plan is to make the Park more active by upgrading amenities including; an amphitheater with an annual concert series, splash pad, and playground in support of family recreation and entertainment.
- This will not only give our citizens a reason to be Downtown during the day, but it will also give citizens and visitors a reason to come Downtown in the evenings.
- Zumwalt Park Redevelopment is the first, critical project that coupled with our other investments will help jump start our Downtown Redevelopment efforts




How Do We Know It Will Work?

- There are currently approximately 2,500,000 residents combined within Fresno, Tulare, and Kern counties. This is the primary population base that the amphitheater concert series will be marketed to (1-hour radius).
- Management anticipates the City's concert series will include 20-25 concerts per year with most shows seating between 1,500 to 3,500 ticketed attendees. The proposed venue will likely support up to 5,000 attendees for festivals. Management is estimating around 35,000 - 50,000 attendees per year.
- Based on a recent Nielsen survey, approximately 52% of the U.S. population attends some sort of live music event each year.
- Assuming only 25% of the region's residents interested in attending our concert series, that leaves a pool of 625,000 residents to focus our marketing efforts on. In addition, there are approximately 65,000 vehicles that pass through Tulare each day on Hwy 99 which will serve as another pool of potential patrons for marketing purposes.
- For comparison purposes, the City of Ocala, Florida has a Downtown outdoor concert venue that includes a stage
 and splashpad. The City of Rocklin, California has an outdoor concert venue that includes an amphitheater. We
 have learned lessons from each and will build upon and leverage the success of both projects into what will be a
 much better project in Tulare.

- In 2021, there were 12 concerts and 6 rentals hosting 15,000 attendees from 285 cities and 32 states.
- Some recent or upcoming concerts include; Flock of Seagulls, Warrant, Parmalee, Pablo Cruise, Y&T, The Tubes, The Smithereens, War, Sister Hazel, The Spin Doctors, Starship, The Motels, and Switchfoot among others.





Zumwalt Amphitheater Concept A


is designed to reflect the character & materials of the existing buildings on the park sile, as well as the surrounding architecture. This amphitheater design compliments the traditional & more symmetrical park layout of Concepts 1 & 2, & defines strong public square.

The building has a central stage; musician green rooms are stage left and catering/ V.I.P. support and storage/loading are stage right.


Simple gable roots are covered in rural standing seam metal roofing & brick & concrete wall surfaces are complimented & made more natural with the proposed addition of rich wood surfaces used at the V.I.P. service bar & other accent areas.

is designed to be more sculptural & asymmetrical, complimenting the modern park layout of Concept 3. The architecture reflects the nautical & sculptural character of a Zumwalt-class destroyer - a Naval ship that was named after Tulare native, Admiral Elmo Zumwalt - the very gentleman that inspired the name of our park.

> Its angled multi-faceted roof rises from the ground to soar above the stage surface below. The materials are more facilie with the addition of rich wood surfaces, natural stone walls & column bases & wood structural components.
> The floor plan/space layout of this building is similar to Concept 1 with a central stage; musician green rooms are stage left & catering/ V.I.P. support & storage/loading are stage right.




- Option 2 received the most overall support

- Maritime playground inspired by the USS Zumwalt was supported






RESULTS

PREFERRED CONCEPT PLAN









